With respect to the five impact fee programs in the table above, the amounts reflect gross collections, which do not include refunds. As the Board is aware, boundaries within each impact fee program do not align with Commission District boundaries. Therefore, funds must be spent within the same impact fee program district in which it was collected. Lastly, educational facilities impact fee revenues are transmitted to the Miami-Dade County School Board on a quarterly basis.
