Status Report on FEMA Reimbursements for Hurricane Irma – Directive No. 182307 **Subject:**

Executive Summary

Pursuant to a Board directive, attached as Exhibit I, Status of Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Reimbursements, is the June 2022 monthly report regarding the status of FEMA reimbursements of County expenditures incurred in response to the 2017 Hurricane Irma. In summary, the County submitted 223 projects with an estimated total cost of \$277 million. The County projected to be reimbursed \$265 million with a cost share of \$12 million. Of this, \$254 million has been obligated to date and \$217 million collected.

Background

On September 10, 2017, Hurricane Irma made landfall in South Florida. In anticipation of landfall, the President of the United States declared a Federal Emergency on September 4, 2017, which allowed Miami-Dade to seek Federal and State grants for reimbursement of actual hurricane-related expenditures. The County anticipates that it will incur about \$277 million of Hurricane Irma expenditures overall. These projected expenditures constitute 223 distinct projects as of June 30, 2022. As FEMA continues its review process, estimate and cost share allocations may change.

As of June 30, 2022, FEMA has obligated \$242 million in federal funding with \$12 million in state funding (for the total of \$254 million). FEMA and the State of Florida have paid \$217 million to the County.

⁽³⁾ As per Amendment No.18 to Notice of a Major Disaster Declaration issued by FEMA on August 23, 2019, all projects for all categories were authorized to be amended to 90 percent of total eligible costs, except assistance previously approved at 100%.

⁽⁴a) The \$150,999 (includes local match) and \$143,449 (excludes local match) consist of 2 projects - 35457 and 80941 - that have been submitted to FEMA and the State but that have not been obligated.

⁽⁴b) 13 projects (5204, 25527, 28919, 30580, 33197, 33257, 34673, 34886, 34914, 35647, 35659, 36154, and 37997) were previously obligated by FEMA, but are undergoing additional rework so their status changed to 'Pending Obligation'. However, the State keeps them as 'Obligated' until FEMA makes a final determination.

⁽⁵⁾ Obligated funds for 221 projects as of 06/30/22. The \$253,624,043 is comprised of \$242,192,258.43 in federal funding with \$11,431,786.14 in state funding.

⁽⁸⁾ Project 30577 was closed out and \$28,941.56 in FAL costs was de-obligated. The final obligated amount per the State is \$1,034,473.50 (with \$982,749.83 in Federal and State funding), but FEMA has not updated the final obligated amount (it was \$1,063,415.06, with \$1,010,244.31 in Federal and State funding).

⁽⁹⁾ Project 33197 is being re-worked due to successful appeal and Amendment Request of 406 HMP Items. FEMA estimates the new obligated amount to be \$7,781,497.53 (with \$7,392,422.65 in Federal and State funding) until FEMA makes its final determination.
