This report outlines four options for establishing a library in the Brickell area. Other options include purchasing or building a standalone library near the Metrorail Station (both estimated at \$9.44 million, unfunded) or leasing space at approximately \$1.03 million annually, with a 3% yearly increase. Budget limitations and coordination with DTPW are noted concerns.

This first quarterly report outlines inspections of MIA's mechanical, electrical, plumbing (MEP), and IT systems as part of its modernization strategy. Structural inspections estimate \$66.9 million in needed repairs, with funding addressed through three maintenance programs totaling over \$137 million in the FY 2024-25 budget. Five high-priority repairs under the Reserve Maintenance Program include Concourse H, the E Satellite APM Bridge, and the Terminal D computer room.

The report also details progress on MIA's \$7.4 billion Capital Improvement Program, with \$1.7 billion allocated for terminal upgrades and \$57 million for recertification repairs. Ten major projects are highlighted, and a separate IT infrastructure assessment is pending.

The grant fully funds the initiative with no County match required, and \$72,523 will be used to cover County staff time for project management. The data collected will not be used for federal regulatory purposes but will help assess local air quality issues and inform future community-level policies.
