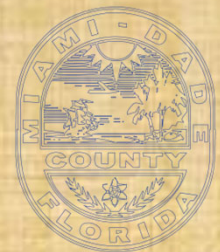

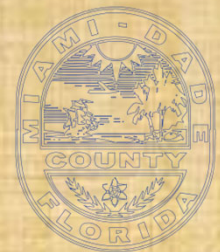
November 2018 Elections

- Constitutional Revision No.10
 - Statewide Referendum – passed with 63% of the statewide vote
 - 58% of voters in the County voted favorably
- County Referendum No. 3
 - Countywide Referendum allowing for elections of Constitutional Offices to be non-partisan, contingent on a change to State Law
 - Measure was rejected by 51% of County voters



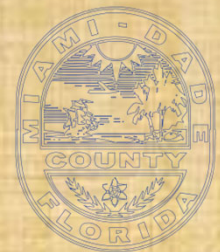
Sheriff Transition

- OPBA report addressed Sheriff transition and its direct impact to UMSA
- Also outlined three potential options
 - Status Quo
 - Sheriff Performing Statutory Sheriff Duties
 - Hybrid Implementation
- Began to list topics for the Board's consideration



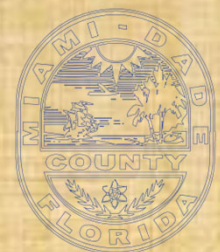
Implementation of Amendment 10

- OPBA conducted additional research based on discussions at the last Chairman's Council of Policy
- Report outlines the duties of each office, considerations that apply to all offices and considerations for each specific office



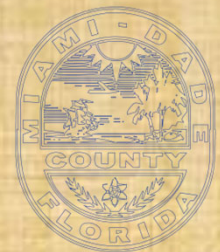
Duties of Each Constitutional Office

- State Statutes delineate the specific duties of each office
- Through prior reorganizations, most duties are already under a single department or division
- The transition to Constitutional Offices will require a decision on whether certain functions will remain with those officials or with the County



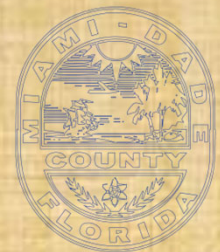
Considerations for all Constitutional Offices

- Personnel Considerations
 - New hires, collective bargaining and classified rights
- Facilities and Assets
 - Acquisition of space, vehicles and other equipment
- Ongoing Operations and Maintenance
 - Ongoing support for office spaces, facilities and assets



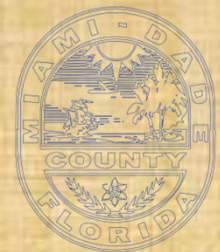
Considerations for all Constitutional Offices

- Paying for Certain Functions
 - Centralized Support
- Countywide Administrative Functions
 - IT platforms
 - Procurement
 - Human Resources
 - Fiscal management and oversight
- Procedures



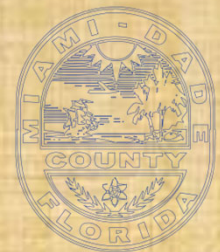
Considerations for the Sheriff

- Future role of the Miami-Dade Police Department
 - Services provided at facilities of Countywide significance
 - Local police patrol services
 - Community policing and outreach initiatives
- Corrections & Rehabilitation and Fire Rescue Services
- Ongoing support of Countywide police functions
 - Specialized police services
 - Communications, crime lab, etc
- Independence related to purchases of supplies and equipment



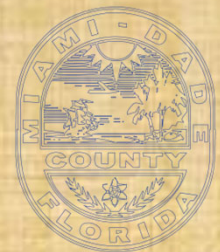
Considerations for the Supervisor of Elections

- Acquisition of supplies and equipment
 - 2025 is a municipal election year
- Administration of Financial Disclosures
- Use of County staff as poll workers



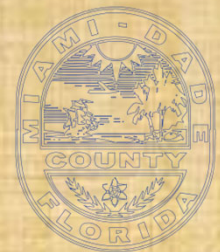
Considerations for the Tax Collector

- Multi-million-dollar impact to the Countywide General Fund
- Require onboarding of administrative staff



Considerations for the Clerk of Courts & Property Appraiser

- Implications on the County's financial oversight
- Potential need for MOUs to ensure the County remains engaged in accounts payable and payroll functions
